Yet before the sun went down, 57,471 of these men were casualties. The wire had not been cut; the German machine gunners had been waiting. It was the worst day in the history of the British Army. Andrew Roberts evokes the pity and horror of that terrible morning with a masterly grasp of the military realities that led to such a disaster. His moving book is above all the story of how tens of thousands of ordinary men trudged stoically to their deaths."
