

Non-signatory states in international refugee law

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Résumé ou extrait : "We are at a critical juncture in the development and application of international refugee law. On the one hand, the continued relevance of the 1951 Convention relating to the Status of Refugees¹ and its 1967 Protocol² ("the Refugee Convention"³) has come under doubt, and political and scholarly debates about "the end" of the global refugee protection regime are ongoing. ⁴ On the other hand, major refugee-hosting countries in several regions of the world are not party to the Refugee Convention, leading some mainstream scholarship and practice to view them or their regions as an "exception" to international refugee law."
