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Résumé ou extrait : Since the first publication in 1979, Roosevelt's foreign policy has come under attack on three points : Was Roosevelt responsible for the confrontation with Japan that led to the attack at Pearl Harbor ? Did Roosevelt give away Eastern Europe to Stalin and the U.S.S.R. at Yalta ? Did Roosevelt abandon Europe's Jews to the Holocaust, making no direct effort to help them ? In a new afterword, Dallek vigorously and convincingly defends Roosevelt's policy. He emphasizes how Roosevelt operated as a master politician in maintaining a national consensus for his foreign policy throughout his presidency and how he brilliantly achieved his policy and military goals.
